# Weekly Studies



The Weekly Bible Study with The Reverend Ed: This Sunday, November 17th, we will discuss John 18:33-37, A kingdom not of his own. On Sunday, November 24th, we will discuss Luke 21:25-36, coming of the Son of Man.

The Tuesday Morning Book Study will not meet during November, but we will be reading *The Remarkable Ordinary: How to Stop, Look, and Listen to Life* by Frederick Buechner which assists us in preparing for Advent by looking closely at our lives. "Our remarkable life is happening right here, right now. The ordinary points you to the extraordinary God who created and loves all of creation, including you. You may not be able to see it--your life may seem predictable and your work insignificant until you look at your life as Frederick

Buechner does... pay attention to the remarkableness right in front of us, to watch for the greatness in the ordinary, and to use our imaginations to see the greatness in others and love them well. Pay attention, says Buechner. As you learn to pay attention to your life and what God is doing in it, you will uncover the plot of your life's story and the sacred opportunity to connect with the Divine in each moment.

Book Study will return on Tuesday, December 3 as we begin our Advent devotion with *Advent Presence: Kissed by the Past; Beckoned by the Future* by Bud Holland

"Advent is a time of preparation, of patience, of remembering what grounds and sustains us. Advent reminds us who God is and who we are meant to be. This book offers a new look at Advent by seeing the four weeks through the lens of morning, mid-day, late afternoon and evening, and night. Photographs, stories, and perspectives enrich our travel and invite us to other dimensions of experiencing Advent, as a season and as a resource in our daily living with a particular focus on the Year C Gospel readings from Luke."
