Christian Education at St. Paul's: We believe in making "God is Everywhere" real for our young people and helping them see the many ways Christians share the Fruit of the Spirit through Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self-Control. These concepts are presented through interaction with nature, science experiments, stories from picture books, and the inclusion of the scriptures for each Sunday. We are currently using *The Boy, the Mole, the Fox, and the Horse* by Charlie Mackesy.

On Sunday mornings, Jane (Ms. Jane) Kilpatrick and Aiyana (Miss Flowers) Flowers greet families. Ms. Jane, Director of Christian Education and Family Ministries, has been with St. Paul's since 2015. She has a Master's in Christian education and has served in Episcopal churches for over 20 years. Miss Flowers, Nursery Coordinator, has been with St. Paul's since 2016. She has a Masters in Literacy from Winthrop University and is a third-grade teacher. Each week, nurturing and vibrant volunteers join us in cultivating relationships with the children.

Nursery (Birth – Age 4) and Kids' Corner begin at 10:15 Last Sunday, three of the Nursery children painted a scene from *The Boy, the Mole, the Fox, and the Horse,* along with their older peers. Their smiles were contagious and the excitement over their creation was heartwarming.



Historic Paradise Foundation (HPF) – Paper supplies are greatly needed!

Summer enrichment camp will begin a week after school ends. The following items are especially needed:

Paper towels, Paper napkins, Paper plates, Toilet paper

Any brands and any quantity/package size are most appreciated! This drive runs through Sunday June 2, 2024. We would like to gather enough supplies to last HPF through the end of this school year and provide enough to get them through the first session of summer enrichment camp (through mid July). Please leave your donated paper supplies in the LARGE marked plastic storage bin located in Close Hall. Thank you in advance for your assistance in supporting the children from the Paradise community!!

Defend the Fatherless will be honoring National Foster Care Month with UNDIES SUNDIES

during the month of May. They will be collecting NEW underwear, sports bras, and pajamas in children and adult sizes to distribute at the York County Foster Closet, a local outreach through Defend the Fatherless. Foster and kinship families can shop at no cost for essential items when a new child enters their home through foster care and can return for supplies as the child grows while in their care. The average length of time in foster care in our area is 6 months to 2 years.

Collection items: The York County Foster Closet carries pajamas in size 12 months to KIDS 14/16 and underwear in sizes 2T to adult (small, medium, large). They are requesting all **NEW** items for this clothing drive. Items can be left in the office or given to Janice Hage.

Fort Mill Care Center: The Care Center's pantry is very low.. The needs for May include cereal, spaghetti and pasta sauce, tuna, chunky or Progressive soup, macaroni and cheese, snacks (granola bars, fruit cups, sandwich crackers, etc).
